He has been the Director of Out-patient Services for a four county chemical dependency treatment program, executive director of a family service agency, and Director of Mental Health at Clifton Springs Hospital and Clinic. He has taught a number of undergraduate and graduate courses at Syracuse University, University of Buffalo, St. John Fisher College, Ithaca College and RIT. These include courses on sexual offender evaluation and treatment.

He is a consultant to BOCES, numerous mental health clinics and hospitals on the issue of sexually-aggressive behaviors and on sexual capacity. Bill Chaired the ATSA AASECT Task Force on Professional Standards for the treatment of sexual offenders in 1995. He has been in private practice for the last 15 years. Bill completed a yearlong study at the University of Rochester, Department of Pediatrics as a LEAH fellow in adolescent medicine in 2004. He will be speaking on the topic of "Sexual Offenders with Developmental Disabilities".

Target Audience: Community Mental Health Staff. Service Coordinators, Administrative and Clinical Staff, Probation Officers, Sex Therapists, Health Educators

Program

This training will acquaint participants with sex offender evaluation and treatment, as well as the role of the provider in this process. An overview of sex offender demographics and incidents is addressed. When and how to conduct a sex offender evaluation is demonstrated, along with presentation of different types of scientific measurements to support the validity of the assessment. (These will include information on the Hare Psychopathy Scale and the Abel Visual Screen).

The interconnection between the agency serving the consumer, the criminal justice system, sex offender treatment is attended to with inclusion of example contracts and agreements. Treatment methodologies for sex offenders will be discussed. Case materials will be used to accent the information.

Education Goal:

Instruct the treatment provider on the evaluation, diagnosis, and treatment issues of the sex offender client who is developmentally disabled.

Objectives:

- Participants will be able to identify two sex offender profiles that possess the greatest risk of re-offense.
- Participants will be able to name three essential steps that are needed prior to the evaluation of the sex offender.
- Participants will be prepared to establish written agreements between the treatment provider, the client who is being treated in relation to his/her sexual offending and the criminal justice system that will detail the treatment process.

Course Hours:
